2 out of 3 professionals are not project management certified but are expected to manage projects.






### Teams are ever more varied and virtual

80% now collaborate across functions and 59% are geographically dispersed, making it **more difficult to communicate.** 

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The Project Management Office (PMO) has a stake in the game

72% of projects are governed by a PMO, **creating both challenges and opportunities** for those who manage projects.





# Too many disparate tools are hurting team productivity


Teams now use an average of 5.6 approaches to support project collaboration, with 4 traditional tools at the top: email, audio conferencing, web conferencing, and spreadsheets.

One-quarter say no one uses the same tools.

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### **Businesses are suffering the consequences**
